How does this information help me?

This information is important to ensure we deliver fair and equitable service for all. It also helps us expand access to our programs and lets us know:

- Who our benefit payments are helping.
- Who may be unaware of benefits they could be eligible for.
- What unintended barriers may impact benefits and services.
- Where to expand outreach efforts and increase program awareness.

Privacy Act Statement: Section 702 of the Social Security Act, as amended, allows Social Security to collect race and ethnicity information, which we will use for research and statistical purposes. Providing the information is voluntary; not providing all or part of the information will not affect you. As law permits, Social Security may use and share the information you submit.
