V. <u>Explanation of Changes in Board Membership or Structure</u>

Due to staffing changes since last year's report, the agency has the following two new DIB

members:

- (1) Chad Poist replaced Michelle King as Deputy Commissioner for Budget, Finance, and Management;
- (2) Michelle A. King replaced Grace M. Kim as Deputy Commissioner for Operations;

VI. <u>Disapproved Agreements</u>

SSA's DIB did not disapprove any matching agreement during calendar year 2023.

VII. Violations

Match 1051 with the Department of Education that expired October 10, 2023

This agreement provided that ED and SSA would exchange information concerning "applicants," which was a defined term in the agreement to include borrowing student applicants and borrowing parent applicants. ED identified that it included requests for information to SSA concerning individuals beyond the defined scope of "applicants." ED and SSA are working on short and long-term solutions to meet both agencies' needs and have ensured that the reestablished October 11, 2023, agreement accurately covers the exchange.

VIII. Cost-Benefit Requirements

A. Cost-Benefit Analysis (CBA) Ratio

While SSA's DIB ordinarily needs a favorable cost benefit ratio before proceeding with any matching programs, SSA did proceed with three agreements having an unfavorable or unmeasurable cost-benefit analysis as explained below:

• <u>Match 1003</u> with the Department of Labor (Black Lung Part C Benefit Payments):

Section 224(h)(l) of the Social Security Act, (42 U.S.C. § 424a(h)(l)) mandates any Federal agency to provide SSA with information in its possession that SSA may need for making a timely determination of the amount of reduction required under section 224 of the Act for workers' compensation offset.

Our matching agreements are effective for a two-and-a-half year or 30-month cycle (18-month establishment and 12-month renewal) and the current CBA ratios calculations date back to the 2022 reestablishment. As indicated in our prior year report, the Covid-19 pandemic affected the ratio figures for this earlier time period because SSA temporarily suspended processing and collection of some overpayments and adverse action workloads during it. Consequently, the

agency realized lower savings from retroactive overpayment development and recovery, and adjustment of benefit payment amounts to prevent future improper payments. Moreover, the costs to SSA to perform the matches and development work in the field offices had increased. Despite the temporary net that resulted in a negative CBA ratio of .09 to 1, this matching agreement normally provides favorable CBA ratios and SSA considers it a valuable program integrity tool that mitigates improper payments. We expect a better ratio with the upcoming 2024 agreement reestablishment.

Therefore, SSA's DIB continues to recommend the continuation of this matching program.

• *Match 1038* with the Bureau of the Fiscal Service, Department of Treasury:

The benefit to the United States Treasury for this matching operation is the correction of those cases where there is a decrease in the monthly payment amount and the recovery of detected overpayments totaling \$722,011. The overall cost for developing and operating this CBA totals \$842,649. While this matching program currently has a negative CBA ratio of 0.86 to 1, it remains the most efficient and comprehensive method of collecting and comparing information. Also, there is currently no other administrative activity that can effectively provide the information. This ongoing matching program continues to support accurate eligibility determinations that help avoid improper payments.

Therefore, SSA's DIB continues to recommend the continuation of this matching program.

• *Match 1052* with the Veterans Administration (VA):

VA is statutorily required to verify income data reported by medical care applicants and SSA provides verified income information reported to medical care applicants to VA at no cost (38 U.S.C. § 5106). Federal law also authorizes SSA to disclose certain tax return information to VA (26 U.S.C. § 6103(l)(7)). While this matching program currently has a negative CBA ratio of .267:1, it remains the most efficient and comprehensive method of collecting and comparing the information because there appears to be no other administrative activity can efficiently accomplish these verifications and disclosures. Also, in the past, this agreement has provided favorable CBA ratio (2.2:1) and could do so again. At the time of this report, it is not clear why it changed to negative.

Therefore, SSA's DIB continues to recommend the continuation of this matching program.

• <u>Match 1097</u> with the Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS):

Section 1413 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA)

mandates the use of a matching program to provide for the streamlined application process required by Congress. As a result, this ongoing matching program supports accurate eligibility determinations that help avoid improper payments, but similar to the previous year, there is no data available to quantify the number of improper payments avoided. This continues to be a situation where the match results are not currently used to identify or recover past improper payments. As such, there are no estimates (i.e., unmeasurable) of avoided or recovered improper payments in the CBA to offset against the costs. The CBA demonstrated that monetary costs to operate the eight Marketplace matching programs were approximately \$58.9 million, but it does not quantify direct governmental cost saving benefits sufficient to offset the costs because the Marketplace matching programs are not intended to avoid or recover improper payments. The CBA, therefore, does not demonstrate that the matching program is likely to be cost-effective. As along as PPACA is effective as is, we do not foresee any changes to the upcoming 2024 agreement reestablishment.

Therefore, SSA's DIB continues to recommend the continuation of this matching program.

B. Waiver of Cost-Benefit Analysis (CBA)

SSA's DIB granted the following agreements a waiver to the usual cost-benefit analysis requirement pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552a(u)(4)(B):

• Match 1007 with the Railroad Retirement Board (RRB)

HHS/SSA and RRB DIBs granted this waiver in 1992 when SSA was part of the Department of Health and Human Services. The match assures the effective administration of the two benefit programs. The information SSA provides to RRB is not available from other sources, so a CBA is not a factor in determining whether this exchange occurs.

Therefore, SSA's DIB continues to recommend the continuation of this matching program and waiving the CBA.

• Matches 6000 and 6003 for State/State Agency Model Agreements for State Data Exchange

The waiver for these matches began in March 2008 and continues onward into the present. The matches assure the effective administration of state benefit programs. The information SSA provides to state agencies is not available from other sources, so a CBA is not a factor in determining whether this exchange occurs.

Therefore, SSA's DIB continues to recommend the continuation of this matching program and waiving the CBA.

IX. Adherence to Terms

SSA fully adhered to the terms of each matching program in which it participated during calendar year 2023.

X. <u>Justification</u>

All disclosures of SSA records used in matching programs during calendar year 2023 were, and remain, justified.
